Interim Times

This month's article involves understanding conflict and power. "Conflict and power are normal elements of life in congregations. Problems occur when conflicts get out of reasonable control or when power is used to manipulate individuals or groups in the church to the advantage of one person or group and to disadvantage of others."

Although conflict may be seen as a normal part of the life of a congregation, there are times when the conflict is simply not healthy and will cause harm to the congregation as well as the parties caught up in the conflict. The following are some signs that usually indicate that conflict is being handled in an unhealthy manner:

- The anger being expressed seems more intense than the surface issue warrants.
- The disputants cannot separate the issues from the people with whom they disagree. People, rather than issues, are the focus.
- The actions or beliefs of the opposition are viewed as sinful or morally wrong instead of alternate ways of acting.
- Communication is diminished or essentially non-existent.
- Indications of vindictiveness will be prevalent in unhealthy conflict.
- Disputants express a long list of issues and begin to recall other unresolved issues from the past.
- People deny their real feelings about the conflict or about unresolved issues.
- People refuse to accept any solutions to the conflict.

Using conflict constructively means taking the energy and interest that people have invested in the conflict and letting them create something productive or useful. Following are some guidelines for using a conflict situation constructively:

- Embrace the conflict as an experience with the

potential for something positive instead of viewing it as something fearful.

- Offer those being affected by the conflict opportunity for defining the issues and searching for the solutions. Take control of the situation by defining its purpose and developing a plan of action.
- Limit discussions to the real issues and do not allow other unrelated issues to be brought into the process.
- Assume that all parties who are engaged in the conflict bring some truth to the discussion.
- Seek to find the commonalities and build on them while valuing the differences.
- Emphasize finding answers that meet the needs and interests of all parties rather than focusing on specific positions.
- Make use of spiritual resources and form the discussion as a discernment process, then allow time for the process to work.
- Work for agreements that are tolerable, even if not fully acceptable, to all people involved.

In church conflict the goal should not be an end in which there are declared winners and losers. When this conflict does exist, those involved must engage in dialogue rather than debate or discussion. Dialogue is a free exploration that brings to the service the full depth of people's experience and thought, and yet can move beyond their individual views. Genuine dialogue is intended to help church leaders and members to make wise and "spirit-led" discussions.

Let us all hear the Word of the Lord, his love and acceptance of us all, and use that to guide us all together as we face conflicts in our lives.

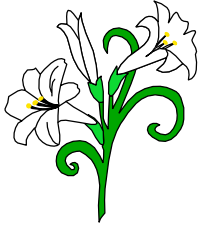

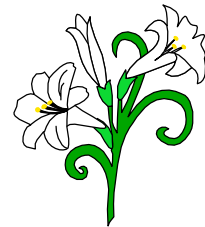

Changes in Florida Law concerning Powers of Attorney

Florida passed a new law dealing with Powers of Attorney. It is referred to as a "springing" durable power of attorney. There is a major difference between a "springing" power of attorney and a regular durable power of attorney. If you have signed a durable power of attorney as part of your estate planning, the difference is very important to you.

If you have previously signed a durable power of attorney, it was effective the instant it was signed. This means that someone else has the legal right to deal with your property. Typically, the power of attorney gave someone else the right to sign your checks and even sell your property.

The new "springing" durable power of attorney is only effective if your doctor certifies that you are unable to handle your own property. Most people would prefer to have the new "springing" power of attorney because it is safer and keeps you in control of your property.

If you have executed a durable power of attorney before January 1, 2002, you have the older form. If you want to change the power of attorney to the new "springing" form, which is only effective should you become incapacitated, you should call your lawyer and have him or her revise the power.
