But, you are curious as to what was cleaned in your home and with which sponge. The problem is, you can't tell simply by looking at the sponges since they all look the same ... so what do you do? You choose to squeeze each sponge to see what comes out. As you squeeze the first sponge, you see that cola comes out, and so you decide that someone cleaned a spill in the kitchen with that one.

Upon squeezing the second sponge, you find it contains tub and tile cleaner - surely that one was used to clean the bathroom. Next, in the third sponge, you find some motor oil, and grease - hubby was cleaning the garage. In the fourth sponge, baby powder puffs out when it is squeezed - yep, the baby's nursery was done with that one! 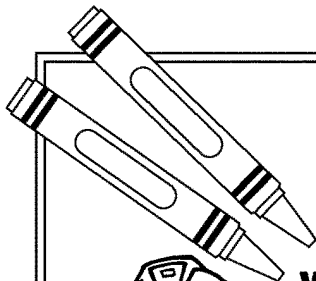
